Looking to the Future- Plan of Action for the Forum

Introduced by Steve Smith from Warwickshire County Council

The Forum was asked to agree a plan of action for the Forum in the next 12 months.

- Affordable Housing
- Facilities for Young People
- Health Issues
- Local Economy
- Traffic and Transport

The Forum queried cross-border health issues Studley and other areas face sorting out Care Packages between the Alexandra Hospital and Warwickshire Social Services.

Caron Williams from NHS Warwickshire and John Soros from Social Services together with a further representative were in attendance to explain procedures for patients who have faced difficulties when ready to go home from hospital as Care Packages are not in place. Often sons and daughters of patients who are elderly themselves find it even more difficult to sort things out:

- When referrals are received assessment and a care plan goes into action. Dependant on discharge date given by the hospital. If this is correct then packages can be completed in the allotted time.
- Problems and delays occur due to different discharge dates, to the ones given to Social Services team
- Would like to see a Care Worker based at the Alexandra Hospital to be on hand when issues do occur.
- Warwickshire work with many hospitals outside the County boundary and patients have the same access to a care team wherever they are.
- Most delays occur due to cost of care and a resource being found. More difficult with Care Homes as it is a limited resource and some homes are more popular than others. In more rural areas this is more of a problem.
- Lots of discussion about problems which will multiply as the population gets older. Would like to see some actions.

Facilities for Young People exploring the change of opening hours of Studley Youth Centre – Seven buildings could be used for the Private Functions taking place at the Youth Club which would free up the facility on a Friday night.

Next step is to work with the Community which is a really good idea. They could get involved in the monthly litter picks and there could be a joint initiative with the Parish Council to resurface the skate park.

Lighting of 'the Cage' an ongoing problem but is expensive and no funding is available.
