Community Priorities

Warwickshire Police is obliged to protect communities from harm in line with the 'Police Priorities'.

This may mean that in exceptional circumstances SNT officers may be required to work on other policing priorities.

If this happens there will be a need to re-negotiate priorities. This will be done in liaison with the Chair and the panel.



Warwickshire Police Priorities 2009/10


To reduce the number of people killed or seriously injured

- *Reduce the number of people killed or seriously injured through road traffic collisions compared with last year*
- *Reduce the number of people killed or seriously injured as a result of violence compared with last year*
- *Detect 45% of crimes where someone is killed or seriously injured*
- *Increase the number of serious sexual offences we detect compared with last year*
- *Reduce the number of victims of aggravated burglary and robbery compared with last year*
- *Identify and charge 15 members of organised crime groups whose activities harm communities*

To reduce the number of homes burgled and vehicle crimes committed

- *Reduce the number of homes burgled and vehicles stolen by three percent compared with last year*
- *Reduce theft from vehicles by five percent compared with last year*

To improve trust and confidence

- *Local Safer Neighbourhood teams will deliver 100% of agreed policing activity that protects people from harm and supports Community Forum priorities*
 - *Increase the number of victims of serious sexual offences who report crimes to us compared with last year*
 - *Ensure 85% of victims are satisfied with the overall experience they receive*
 - *Increase confidence (measured by survey)*

Keep the Newsletter the same: Agreed policing activity was for Sgt Shaw to make representations to organisation to that effect.

Sgt Bob Shaw has made contact with organisation and a volunteer has been taken on to create a newsletter. The proposal is that it will be a monthly publication and will cover the area covered by the Safer neighbourhood Team and the Community Forum.

Parking around junction Arden Road and Castle Road
Henley : Agreed policing activity was to visit area on 24
occasions.

We have visited the area on a recorded 26 occasions
since the last Forum. A visit to a particular resident by
a local councillor alleviated some of the problem but
when the schools went back after the Summer holidays
the congestion again mounted. The main issues
appear to be due to volume of traffic when children are
being dropped off at school and when the schools
finish.

Antisocial Behaviour in fields behind Wickham Road in Studley:

We have logged 30 recorded visits to area over the fields since the last forum. We have found youths on 4 occasions, in these instances there were no issues of concern. We have moved several youths on from the area of the church car park on Castle Road and from the disused buildings at Studley Castle during this same period.

National Approach: **CONTEST** The UK Government's Counter Terrorism Strategy



Preventing Violent Extremism

Prevent is a key strand of the Government's counter-terrorism strategy, **CONTEST**. Its main objective is to stop people becoming terrorists or supporting violent extremism.

Prevent has five key strands to support this overall objective:

- Challenge the violent extremist ideology and support mainstream voices
- Disrupt those who promote violent extremism and support institutions where they are active
- Support individuals who are being targeted and recruited to the cause of violent extremism
- Increase the resilience of communities to violent extremism
- Address the grievances that violent extremists are exploiting

Local delivery is key

Preventing violent extremism begins in the community. We have a responsibility to identify and protect vulnerable individuals, and to ensure that we don't give a platform to violent extremists.

We can achieve this only by **all communities** working together locally and nationally to share best practice and endeavour to protect vulnerable individuals and to prevent violent extremists from having a voice in the UK.



Other matters of interest:

The promise of a new PCSO for the team has again come to the fore. We have again been promised a new Community Support Officer from the next intake, this intake has just started their training.

Operation Orleans 2 has run for all of October and was aimed at reducing antisocial behaviour in the run up to Halloween and Bonfire night. For example shops were asked not to sell eggs and flour to youths etc. In 2005 there were approximately 23 reported incidents of antisocial behaviour in Studley in 90 minutes early on Halloween evening. This year there were no such incidents reported on Halloween.

Op Kirby is an 8 weeks initiative aimed at reducing overnight vehicle crime. It started on the 19th October and finishes on the 8th of December 09.

David Hall has now been charged with 3 offences relating to possession and supply of class A controlled drugs. He is due to appear at Warwickshire Magistrates Court again on the 4th December 09.
