Min 405 Cllr Bacon: 6th month review of allotment plot holder. Has until

1st April 2009 to clear plot and is doing so. Need to closely monitor situation.

Cllr Mrs Wersocki has spoken to the Allotments Officer in Redditch who is happy to come and to talk to Parish Council about how their allotments are run. Plot holders pay for water supply in Redditch. Alcester charge more for residents who live outside area. Dunstall Road allotments are clearing 7 new plots. Have been given money for use of digger. Plots should then be allocated to local people. Meeting to be arranged with Allotments Officer to discuss new rules and guidelines after Allotment Association have held their meeting.

- Min 421 Bonfires on the allotments: e mail received from Mr Close on behalf of Residents of Augustine Avenue about a fire on Station Road allotments on 2nd March 2009 from 3.00pm onwards. Copy sent to all Councillors. In the past resident has complained about fires affecting his immediate family but this was so bad (photo attached) that he sought opinion of neighbours. Fumes appeared highly toxic and penetrated into homes. Affects the health of his wife and neighbours. Asking for reassurance that there will be no more fires on the allotments.
 - Need to have bonfires occasionally to get rid of disease. Most people are responsible when having fires.
 - Suggested to Secretary of Association to nominate so many bonfire days and notify residents in advance.
 - Was not all gardening material that was burned on 2nd March 2009. Should only be gardening material and people should be encouraged to compost and recycle. Trees can be shredded by the Council.
 - Could be some negotiation between the Allotment Association and the residents as this is an issue, maybe the Parish Council could act as mediator.
 - Cllrs Bacon and McCarthy to attend Allotment Association meeting on 26th March 2009. Going to develop a set of guidelines and put forward a list of ideas.

RESOLVED: Clerk to write to Mr Close explaining that the Parish Council have no jurisdiction to prevent bonfires and enclose leaflets detailing legislation.

Min 407 Public Path Diversion Order 2009 (Footpath AL164 Studley) e mail received from Chris Williams, Rights of Way Officer (Legal Orders). The Lane does not carry any known public right of access. In the event the term 'Green Lane' has no foundation in law. Would like confirmation of email of 17th December 2008 that Parish Council has no objection to the Order. Cllr Vale has spoken to the owner of the land and has seen the paperwork.

Studley Charities had right of way to their fields but now rescinded and have an alternative route.

RESOLVED: Clerk to write and confirm that the Parish Council has no objection to the Diversion Order but are investigating the 'Green Way'. Cllr Wersocki to sort out paperwork.

Attended Beacon Award Ceremony in London. Stratford District Council were awarded Beacon Status for outstanding work in digital inclusion. Award recognises local governments excellence and innovation in improving quality of life for residents and communities.
