5. Public Forum

Barbara Beaman: a lot of people in the Village are using mobile scooters and having difficulty getting around corners as gradient on pavements very steep. Clerk to contact Warwickshire County Council.

Proposed Aldi Store: residents already written to Planning Officers with their views.

- Concerns about the entrance and exit and design of building.
- Traffic implications could further congest the Barley Mow Island.
- Concerns that drive will be less pleasant if trees and hedges are removed.
- Concerned about a portion of land that is not in plan. What will happen to this land?
- Pedestrian crossing will exacerbate traffic problems. Make Redditch Road more hazardous.
- Land at rear is green belt being ignored. Opportunity to make it a conservation area.
- Design of building is inappropriate. Curved roof design as seen on some Aldi buildings would be preferable.
- SDC should defer decision until Highway report received from WCC.
- Island area has already been identified as polluted.
- Why another supermarket?
- Cllr Vale: would attract more people to the Village and maybe an asset. Shops are always closing.
- Cllr Mrs Bell: would concur with what has been said, but has spoken to local traders
 who want more people coming into the Village. If no decision made could be a
 derelict site for 12 months. If industrial units were put there could be traffic problem
 with lorries. What would residents like to see on site?
- Advantages are that the store would bring employment to the Village and an alternative shopping facility which could be beneficial to other shops. Enough

empty shops and could be even more if it goes the way it is at present.

• Disadvantages are additional traffic. Site may not be attractive.

The Chairman requested that with the permission of the Council item 6 be brought forward.

Aldi Stores Ltd., 2 Birmingham Road, Studley. Demolition of existing buildings and erection of Class A1 food retail store with associated car parking.

Proposed Cllr Rickhards:

Objection for the following planning reasons:

- 1. Poor design of building, not in keeping.
- 2. In accordance with Policy DEV.4 impact of development on vehicular movement and congestion. Traffic already at capacity on A435.
- 3. In accordance with Policy COM. 3 new shops acceptable if main function meets local needs rather than people from elsewhere. Already two supermarkets in the Village and this development would attract people from a wider area.
- 4. Not enough directional signs.

However if the District Council has a mind to approve this application the Parish Council would wish to see the materials to be used. Landscaping needs to be taken into consideration. Seconded Cllr McCarthy. Voting 2 for, 6 abstained.

- Min 189 Studley Sports & Social Club: Thomas Guise Solicitors dealing with a charge on the Club including the bungalow in favour of Carlsberg. Carlsberg want to step in if club goes into liquidation and propose to give notice of 14 days to confirm they wish to become new tenants. The reason being the lease is a valuable interest to SSSC and to Carlsberg. If anything happens they will want to make sure the lease remains in force to enable them to assign the lease to a third party subject to obtaining Parish Council consent. Advice is to accept. Clerk to write to Solicitors to obtain clarification concerning conflict of interest as they are representing both parties concerned and also to invite Brian Ward, Secretary of SSSC to a Parish Council meeting to discuss the matter further.
- Min 196 Quote for new gate at Dunstall Allotments £1997.00 + VAT Hodges & Lawrence Ltd. and £2225.00 JFS Landscape & Garden Services. Further quote received for continuation of security fencing for approximately 40 metres at £75.00 + VAT per metre. Passed to General Purposes Committee to be discussed in detail.
- Min 191 Query from Caroline Ford re street lighting and length of time they are on during the night. One outside her property keeps her awake. Would like to see evidence of running costs as need to save energy with having timed lighting. Clerk has already emailed to say we are on an unmetered supply and pay for number of lights not the hours they are on. Clerk to write that a lot of work and research was done between the Parish Council and the MEB to provide the most energy efficient lighting for Studley. However we could arrange for a cowl to be fitted to the light causing the problem.

- Mr Morgan has one year with the Stratford CVS previously a commercial marketing expert. Is being funded to support Parish Plans and will be reporting to Stratford District Council.
- Idea is to a) publicise successes b) try and help with any small problems such as funding c) champion long term problems.
- Will hope to keep in contact via the Clerk one or twice in the next 6 months. Studley Parish Plan is one of the latest.
- Background to the Parish Plan given by Cllr Hazel Wright.
- Plan has been adopted by SDC but not WCC.
- Weakness if any is that the vast majority of questionnaires were answered by older residents.
- Funding may be available through Virtual District Initiative. Will distribute information when it has been received.
- Plan required for housing needs survey.
- Meeting to be arranged with Cllr Holder to discuss rural youth.
