Following the recent meeting organised by Cllr Hazel Wright and Neighbourhood Watch and attended by a number of different agencies it was agreed that when an incident is recorded on the command and control system the informant will now be given an incident number, this will usually be a four figure number starting with zero such as 0406. This will include incidents of Anti Social Behaviour reported to the Command Control System.

It is still important that residents report any incident that occurs to the Police.

ASPECTS OF PLANNING APPLICATIONS

Planning Law tells us that a site owner is able to do what he likes with the site he owns, unless Planning Law or material considerations (See last newsletter) can persuade the Council's Planning Officers via the Council's Planning Committee to decide otherwise.

If the Council's Committee decides to refuse an application the site owner or developer can appeal to the Planning Inspectorate in Bristol against the decision. This will mean that a Government Planning Inspector will listen to all the arguments for and against and then decide the issue.

However, if the Planning Committee decides to grant permission then there is no right of appeal.

The public, (you and I), have a right to write to the Inspector on appeals and also the right to speak. If a resident exercises the right to speak at the appeal, he or she, may also be questioned by the developer or his lawyer on what he has said or written.

Examples in Studley have been a) Duke of Marlborough appeal was won by the Developer. B) Sibcas site, Brickyard Lane won by Sibcas c) The first plan to develop the Vicarage site was turned down by the Planning Committee but was followed by a different application which was granted.

HOME COMPOST CAMPAIGN

WCC is part of a Nationwide 'Compost at Home' campaign which encourages residents to transform their kitchen and garden waste to Compost.

The Council has teamed up with WRAP (Waste and Resources Action Programme) to provide the bins along with a free guide to composting and a handy sticker highlighting what can and can't go in– delivered direct to peoples doors.
