Graffiti in Skate Park

The Parish Council was very disappointed to find the newly painted skate park vandalised with obscene graffiti during the summer school holiday. The police were able to apprehend the offenders as they were caught on CCTV The youths involved cameras. have since apologised to Full Council. The offenders, under the supervision of the Youth Club, have now repainted the part of the skate park that does not require specialist paint. The Parish Council had to get professional decorators to apply the specialist paint on the other part of the skate park to cover the graffiti, which incurred extra cost that could have been used elsewhere in the Parish for other amenities.

The Council would like to see the facilities that have been provided for them being valued and used responsibly.

The Council would also like to thank all the youths that came forward to offer to repaint the skate park.

Update from Studley Citizens Advice Bureau

Since May 2012, the CAB has been operating a drop in service in the Village Hall on the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of the month from 10 am – 1pm.

The service is open to anyone with problems such as debts, housing, benefits, relationships, consumer issues, etc.

Clients are seen for 10 – 15 minutes to see if the CAB can help 'on the spot or free follow up advice appointments can be made for Alcester or Stratford.

Over 30 Studley clients have used the service over the last few months.

Do we need a Dog Warden?

One of the most common complaints we receive at the Parish Council is about concerns over the level of dog fouling in Studley.

Stratford District Council has asked Parish Councils if we would be willing to fund the cost of a new warden who could extend the existing provision. However, we are not convinced that sufficient time would actually be spent in Studley monitoring the issue if the new warden still had responsibility across the District. Instead of paying towards a District Officer, we are considering if the money would perhaps be better spent on employing a warden in Studley; partly sharing the cost of a part time post with one of our neighbouring parishes. We would like to hear your view on this.

ANNUAL POLICE REPORT (as presented at the Studley NHW AGM 11/07/12)

Offence Burglary	Incidents 19	Notes Offenders have got in via conservatories, insecure doors, windows and via garage doors.
Dwelling Burglary	20	These were at industrial units and domestic premises. Mainly tools and fishing equipment were stolen.
Criminal Damage	57	Some were domestic related. A few incidents were cars being damaged. A male was arrested for causing criminal damage on the High Street.
Theft from Vehicle Motor Incidents	15	2 of these were catalytic converters, also Satnavs & tools stolen. Others were people leaving items on display.
Theft not Related	65	These included attempted thefts. Mostly mobile phones, iPods and where people have left these unattended in public places such as pubs and restaurants. Also high number of drain covers stolen. A male was arrested and is due in court this month. Also theft of lead on roof etc.
Theft Shops & Stal	21 Is	Studley Garden Centre, Aldi & the Co-op. Thefts included food, drink & gardening equipment.
Rowdy	125	A few incidents were domestic related; a few were also called in from pubs. Also vehicle nuisance incidents including 1 where the rider was caught and given suitable advice & another where a car was seized for no insurance.
Robbery	4	One was an attempted robbery where someone tried to steal a car when the owner was sat in it. The offender did not succeed.
Suspicious Incidents	122	Includes vehicles hanging around certain areas and also youths hanging around. People have phoned in to report suspicious persons hanging around areas that have previously had burglaries.

From 1 July- 31 Oct 11 there were 15 incidents recorded of anti-social behaviour.

From 1 Nov 11- 1 July12 there were 9 incidents recorded of anti-social behaviour, most of these being made about Pool Road Car Park with kids playing football. The cage which is situated next to the Youth Club has now been opened 24/7 for kids to play in and there have been no further incidents since then. Also this is our 5th year with no incidents being reported on Halloween Night!
