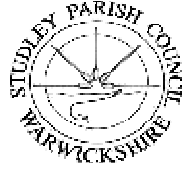

USEFUL INFORMATION

In Case of Emergency

We all carry mobile phones with names and numbers stored in its memory. If we were involved in an accident or were taken ill, the people attending us would have our mobile phone but wouldn't know who to call. Yes, there are hundreds of numbers stored but which one is the contact person in case of an emergency?

Hence this "ICE" In Case of Emergency campaign.

The concept of ICE is catching on quickly. It is a method of contact during emergency situations. As mobile phones are carried by the majority of the population all you need to do is store the number of a contact person or persons who should be contacted during an emergency under the name 'ICE'.

The idea was thought up by a paramedic who found that when he went to the scene of an accident there were always mobile phones with patients but they didn't know which number to call. Therefore he thought if there was a nationally recognized name for this purpose the Emergency Service personnel or hospital staff would be able to quickly contact the right person by dialing the stored number. For more than one contact name simply enter ICE1, ICE2 etc.

This can really help in an emergency.

The 'Right to Roam' in Warwickshire



Changes in the Law provide greater pedestrian access, a 'Right to Roam' across land classed as 'Open Access' land.

Open land includes :

- Mountain
- Moorland
- Heathland
- Downland; and registered common land

In Warwickshire, these landscapes are scarce and less than 1% of the County has been classed as Open Access, although with over 1700 miles of Public Rights of Way, there are plenty of opportunities to visit and enjoy Warwickshire's rich and varied countryside. Visitors to the countryside must however, keep to the official line of the Public Right of Way.

There are seven Country Parks and three Greenways in Warwickshire that provide a variety of recreational activities e.g cycling, walking and fishing.

Studley Community Youth Centre.

Anna Stowe is the new Youth Leader at the Centre. She has already made a huge difference at the Centre and many activities and projects are already being planned for the spring and summer months.

The 'Monday Club' which is an after school club will reopen on 22nd February. It provides somewhere for young people to go after school one afternoon a week.

'All Hands on Deck' is a 10 week project targeting young people not in education, employment or training and also pupils who are beginning to disengage with school. Participants will be aged between 12 and 19 and will be recruited by Connexions and the Youth and Community Service from Henley, Alcester and Studley. The project will take place in the new outdoor Education Centre at Kingsbury Water Park on Mondays from 10am – 3pm starting on Monday 23rd February until Monday 18th May 2009.
