### **CHRISTMAS LIGHTS APPEAL 2006**

It probably seems rather early to talk about Christmas but we need to start fundraising early in the year if we are able to afford any more Christmas Lights for the High Street.

Last year a small group of people managed to raise enough money to put up seven lights inStudley. Our aim is to do better this year. Each light costs £500 to buy including erection costs as they need to be installed by qualified electricians. Thereafter there is a charge of £100 per light to install and remove each year.

As part of this fundraising a Christmas tree is to be erected outside the Village Hall and the lights on the tree will be available for sponsorship. There will be two books kept in the Village Hall listing everyone who has sponsored a light. One will be a book of remembrance and the other a book of joy if something good has happened to you this year such as a wedding or the birth of a baby and you would like to make a donation as a thank you.

There are seven more lights required to put a light on every lamp post in the High Street. We need to raise the money now if we are to be organised by Christmas.

# **Studley Improvement Partnership**

If it is closed it would mean there would be a delay in response to a fire in Studley as the engines would have to come from either Redditch or Alcester and that could mean a matter of life or death.

The Young Fire Fighters Group could also be at risk.

### **CO-OP PLANNING APPLICATION**

The two outline Planning Applications submitted last year to Stratford District Council by the Co-op on land adjacent to the store have been dismissed by the Planning Inspector at a recent planning appeal.

This now means that further revised planning applications will need to be submitted.

Studley Parish Council are at present lobbying the Co-op to try and get hoarding round the site to make the area look more presentable. The security fencing in place is a safety hazard and looks so unsightly in the centre of the village.

We would urge residents to also write to the Co-op Head Office in Manchester to add weight to our arguments.

### **COMMUNITY TRANSPORT**

Stratford District Council have now got four Peugeot minibuses with full disability access at work across the District helping people, mostly the elderly who are 'stuck for transport' get to local markets, banks, visit friends etc.

Those who have made use of the scheme have been very impressed with the service. It runs to Redditch on a Monday and Stratford on a Wednesday

Within the zone which is Henley, Studley and Alcester the cost is £1 per journey (£2 return). Outside zone destinations such as Redditch and Stratford £2 per journey (£4 return).
